

ENCANA BADLANDS SCIENCE CAMP | **PACKING LIST**

SLEEPING

- Sleeping bag rated to 0° Celsius or colder. It can get quite cool at night. (NOTE: We have a few extra blankets at Camp, as well as, a few extra sleeping bags in case of "accidents.")
- Pillow

GEAR

- Water bottles (2)
- Sunscreen and lip balm
- Bug repellent (we have a large supply, but bring your own if you are sensitive to DEET)
- Flashlight (essential for night time trips to the toilet)
- Towels (2 for kids camps)
- Laundry bag (a plastic garbage bag will work)
- Toiletries (toothbrush and toothpaste, deodorant, comb, etc.)
- Medications (NOTE: At kids' camps, all meds except Asthma puffers and Epipens must be left with the Camp Coordinator; at Family Camp, parents will be responsible for their family's medications)
- Small backpack (needed to carry rain jacket, indoor shoes, swim suit and towel, and water bottles)

CLOTHING

- Indoor shoes (for rainy or muddy days)
- Outdoor shoes (sturdy shoes or hiking boots are recommended, no sandals, "Crocs," or flip flops)
- Rubber boots (essential in rainy weather)
- Socks
- Pants
- Shorts
- Long-sleeved shirt
- T-shirts (NOTE: every camper receives a special Encana Badlands Science Camp T-shirt)
- Sweater or fleece
- Underwear
- Rain jacket (essential)
- Rain pants
- Pajamas
- Swim suit (essential)
- Toque and mittens

OPTIONAL

- Camera (Senior campers are invited to participate in a photography workshop hosted by the Museum's staff photographer)
- Books
- Journal

WHAT NOT TO BRING

- Gift Shop money
- Electronic games
- iPods or MP3 players
- Gum, candy, or food* (these attract mice)
- Valuables**
- Knives
- Matches or lighters
- Cell phones or pagers
- Hair dryers or curling irons (there is no electricity at Camp)
- Musical instruments

(*Special needs foods will be kept in our mouse proof cabinets or in the refrigerator.)

**Valuables can be locked up at Camp or in the Museum classroom, but we have very limited space.)
